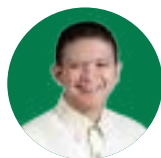

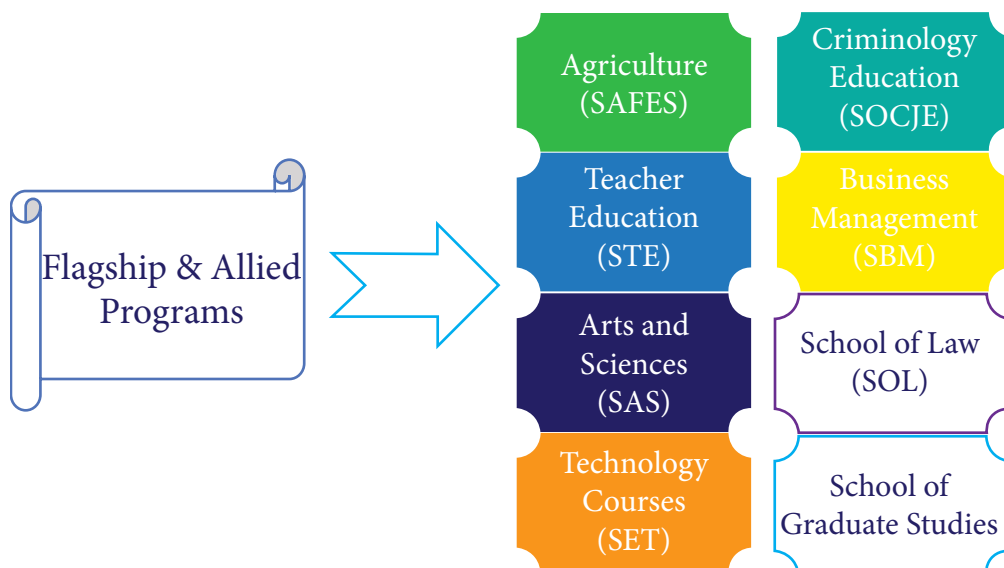

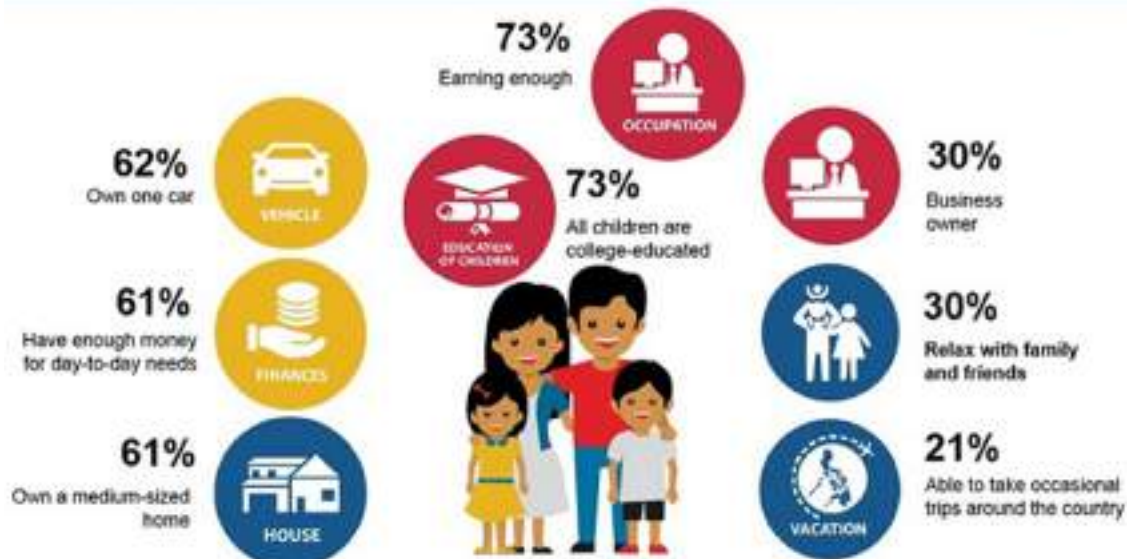

INTRODUCTION

J.H. Cerilles State College under the leadership of President Mary Jocelyn Villejo-Battung accelerated the performance of its four-fold functions of a state college in the areas of instruction, research, extension, and production services as of 2022. It has given a significant impact within and beyond its immediate communities in Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga Peninsula Region.

In Instruction Services, the enrollment reached a total of 11, 163 in 2022, especially in the extension campuses; testament that under President Battung’s leadership, JHCSC has been transformed into the “College of Quality Education for Service” and is a driver of development in the countryside.

With the concerted efforts of 544 faculty members and administrative staff, the college has significantly increased the quality of tertiary education in Zamboanga del Sur. JHCSC continues to have exemplary performance in the Licensure Examinations in different programs. In almost all board programs, the JHCSC passing rate consistently improving to surpass the national passing rate.

It has retained its mark as one of the top performing institutions in Zamboanga Peninsula. The Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP) had accredited more than (fifty percent) 50%

of accreditable programs in consistently higher levels, with 9 Level II and 9 Level I accredited programs. The JHCSC-Dumingag Campus was also identified as the Provincial Training Center for Agriculture. Such excellent performance to attain national quality standards, show the single-minded determination of President Battung in herding the college’s efforts to continuously ensure that its quality education is consistently the best.

Sixty Seven percent (67%) of programs offered in the college have been granted Certificate of Government Recognition/Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) while applications for the rest of the programs are in the process of validation.

The College offers 25 undergraduate and graduate programs in the 3 organic campuses; JHCSC Main Campus in Mati, San Miguel, JHCSC Dumingag and JHCSC Lakewood with 24 Extension Classes all throughout the province of Zamboanga del Sur. In 2022, new programs were offered namely the BS in Entrepreneurship (BSEntrep) and BS in Tourism Management (BSTM) under the newly established School of Business Administration.

There were two thousand one hundred four (2,104) recipients of the student financial support program from 2022-2023. The said students who availed the student financial support program. Thew ESGP-PA Scholar's has a yearly stipend of PhP 40,000.00 per student and TES Grantee's received a Yearly Stipend of PhP 40,000.00 per student. While CHED TDP Grantee's received a yearly stipend of PhP 15,000.00 per student.

During the pandemic, student technical assistants eased the adjustments of faculty in the College's migration to flexible teaching-learning modalities. These numbers are of the highest level in JHCSC's history as one of President Battung's thrusts is the provision of assistance to students especially those who are poor but deserving so as to ensure that they are able to get through to graduation even though financially challenged.



JHCSC honors 1,321 Bar and Board Passers 2022

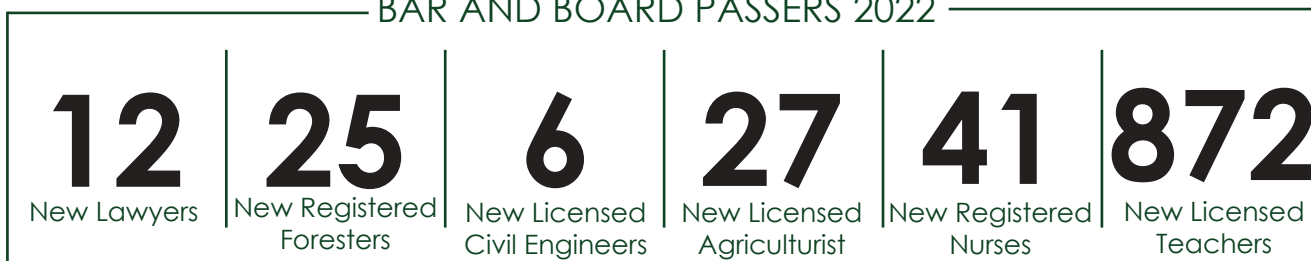

President Dr. Mary Jocelyn Villejo Battung in her message, shared her gratitude for the bar and board passers. She also thanked them for their faith, hard work, and for their commitment to the college.

Meanwhile, the JH Cerilles State College for the year 2022 alone, has produced 6 new Licensed Civil Engineers, 12 new Lawyers, 25 new Registered Foresters, 27 new Licensed Agriculturist, 41 new Registered Nurses and 872 new Licensed Teachers.

This year, another milestone for the College was also achieved. The JHCSC Nursing Department garnered a walloping Institutional passing rate of 84% in the Philippine Nurse Licensure Examination last November 2022 surpassing the National passing rate of only 74.40%.

Percentage of first-time licensure examination takers

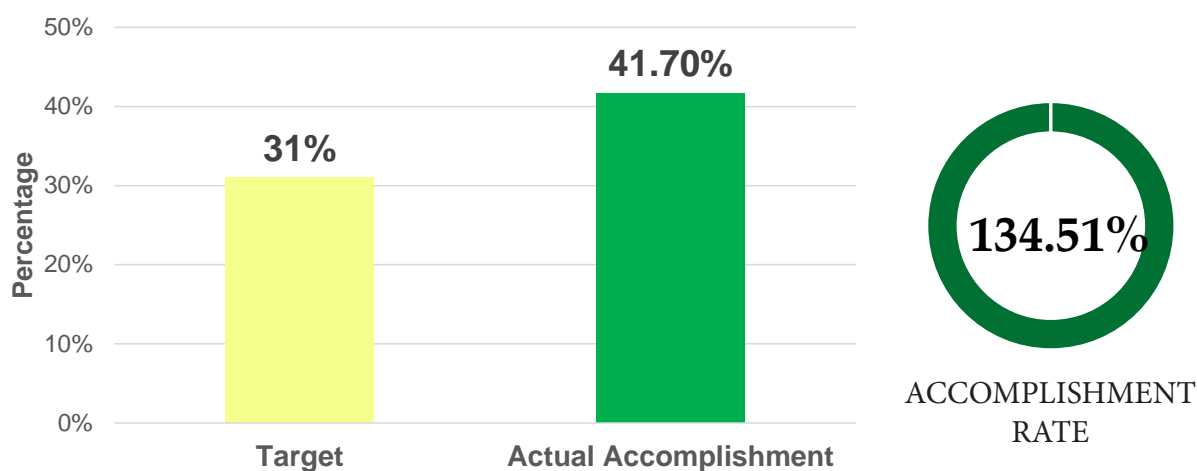


Figure 1: Percentage of first-time licensure examination takers

slowdown experienced in the pandemic years. JHCSC graduates are now the prime movers of their respective sectors in Zamboanga del Sur and beyond.

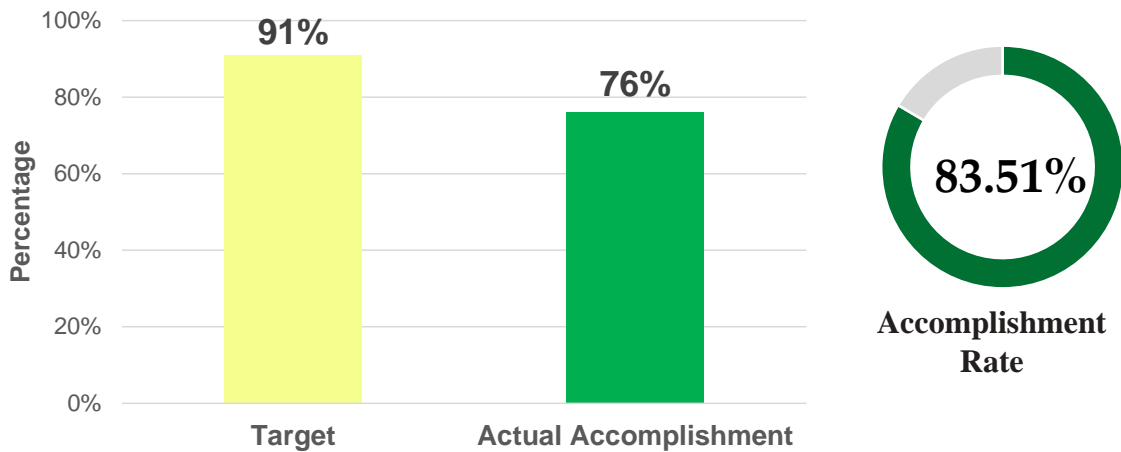


Figure 2: Percentage of Graduates (2 years prior) that are employed

JHCSC has always encouraged enrollment in CHED- identified and RDC- identified priority programs in order to ensure the development of priority industries.

Among the priority courses, Education related programs have the highest percentage

of enrollees with eleven (11%) followed by Information Technology programs with seven percent (7%) and Information Technology with four percent (4%) while other bachelor of arts, criminology and agriculture programs constitute the remaining seventy-eight (78%).

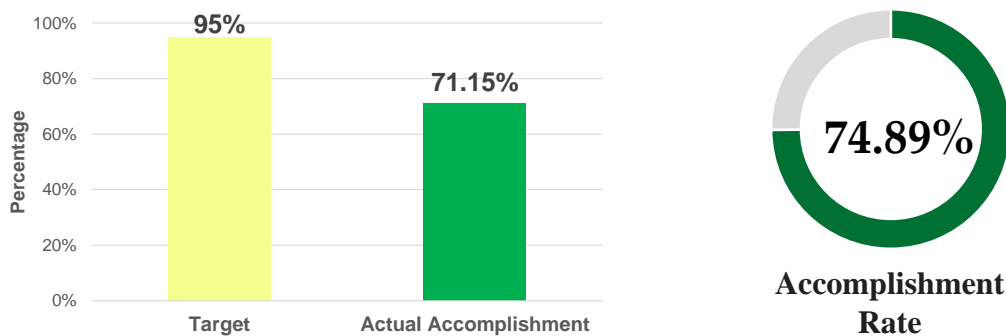


Figure 3: Percentage of the undergraduate student population enrolled in CHED- identified and RDC- identified priority program

Percentage of undergraduate programs with accreditation

In 2022, a total of nineteen (19) programs were accredited out of the twenty-five (25) accreditable programs with ninety-five point twenty-four (95.24%) accreditation percentage as more undergraduate programs were successfully subjected to accreditation by the Accrediting Agencies of Chartered Colleges and Universities of the Philippines (AACUP) having seventy-one

point fourthy-three percent (71.43%) accredited programs in different levels in 2022. The institution participated webinars in preparation to online accreditation, in addition, training for internal quality assurance team and orientation were conducted on an outcomes-based quality assurance and online accreditation orientation.

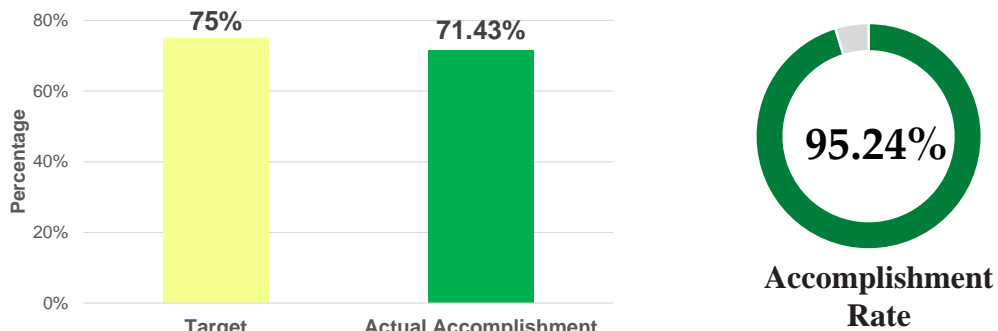


Figure 4: Percentage of undergraduate programs with accreditation

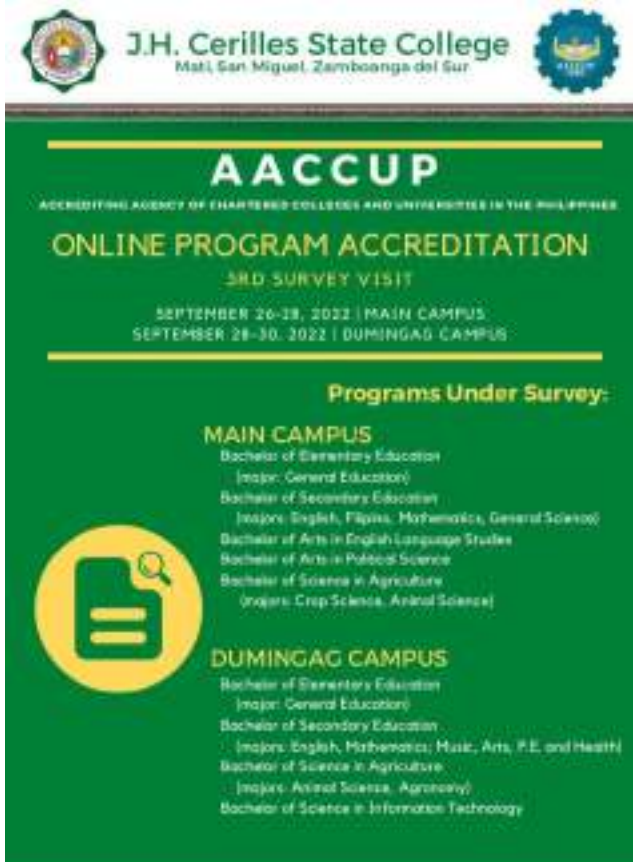
In the Main Campus, 5 (five) were accredited with Level II, while 5 (five) programs were accredited with Level I. In Dumingag Campus, 4 (four) programs are level II and 3 (three) programs are in Level I. In Lakewood Campus, 1 (one) program is in Level I and 1 (one) program is in Level II. Moreover, last September 26-28 and 28-30, 2022, 9 (nine) programs of the JHCSC system underwent 3rd Survey Visit for Level III

Accreditation; 5 (five) undergraduate programs in the Main campus and 4 (four) programs in Dumingag Campus respectively. Results of the recent Level III Accreditation are still on the process of final evaluation and validation with the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines Inc. (AACUP) national head office.

The J.H. Cerilles State College-College of Law kicked off last November 7, 2022 its legal aid services to be handled by Law Student Practitioners (LSP) as the pioneering batch of LSPs were officially presented before Executive Judge Dennis P. Vicoy of the Pagadian City Regional Trial Court (RTC) Branch 20.

Twenty-four (24) LSPs are currently undergoing training and capacity-building as part of the Clinical Legal Education and Legal Aid Program of the JHCSC School of Law.

Also, last November 7, 2022, 33 Juris Doctor (JD) students of JHCSC-SoL took their oath of office as LSPs administered by RTC Executive Judge Dennis P. Vicoy. These law students currently possess a Level 1 Certification allowing a limited practice of law under the guidance of accredited supervising lawyers.

JHCSC-SoL Law Dean Domingo T.

Redelosa IV says the program focuses on the shared responsibility of the law school and the volunteer supervising lawyers to assist students in developing the skills and values required for practice-ready and ethical lawyers wherein the lessons learned in the classroom are translated into meaningful and life-changing action in the real world.

Lawyer and JHCSC-SoL Professor Rose Stephanie D. Florendo, an alumna of the JHCSC of Law, shared a brief explanation of the basic legal services which may be offered by certified LSPs.

RESEARCH SERVICES

INTRODUCTION

The College made particular resolve that the College be able to extend its expertise to the community through research and extension. Her leadership ensured that the Research and Development Agenda (RDA) was continuously aligned to the National Harmonized Agenda 2022. The overarching theme of Resilience Amidst Change' and the sub-themes were clustered into four themes to answer the needs of the stakeholders i.e. colleges, campuses, faculty and students, local community, LGU, NGOs etc. The research and development agenda of the colleges and campuses were aligned to the cross-cutting themes which are more specific.

College Research is now gearing towards technological innovation, thus the challenge is to deliver an output which is innovative either in science and technology or social sciences. Collaborative research and a multidisciplinary approach is best achieved through external funding. Increasing trends of funded researches were notable at present. An indication that more of the faculty researchers are now in the roster of scientists in the funding agencies. Another indicator is that the research outputs are being utilized by the local communities, industry and other beneficiaries in providing solution to their needs and emerging challenges.

There are 109 faculty researchers from 2019 to 2022, who are working on their researches which are vertically aligned to their specialization. This is the result of faculty and development programs of the College where the faculty were sent to various universities, even international, to pursue graduate studies. Researchers were also motivated to complete their researches within the year. This showed that the mentoring and capability trainings of faculty researchers purposely provided by the College were effective. An increase of research outputs were utilized by the industry and other beneficiaries in 2022 was recorded.

The publication incentives granted by the College as reward to those who publish in International referred CHED accredited journals, ISI and Elsevier Scopus motivated the researchers to publish. For the past three years, 27 total number of researches were published in international journal in 2022.

ADDRESSING DIFFICULTY IN CALCULUS LIMITS USING GEOGEBRA

ABSTRACT: This paper aims to address the difficulties of high school students in bridging their computational understanding with their visualization skills in understanding the notion of the limits in their calculus class. This research used a pre-experimental one-group pretest-posttest design research on 62 grade 10 students enrolled in the Science, Technology, and Engineering Program (STEP) in one of the public high schools in Zamboanga del Sur, Philippines. A series of remedial sessions were given to help them understand the function values, one-sided limits, limits of a function, and its discontinuities with the aid of the GeoGebra. Results revealed that there is a significant improvement in their mathematics performance before and after the remediation, $t(61) = -19.99, p < .05$. The real-time feedback provided by the drawing interface of GeoGebra has provided the students the insights into how objects behave in geometrical space, bridging their understanding in locating the values shown by the computational algebraic processes. Additionally, the significant difference in the achievement reveals a large effect size (Cohen's $d = 2.54$) which could be accounted for by the remediation using interactive activities in the GeoGebra.

Research programs/projects

Number of faculty members engaged in research with respect to their specialization

There are more faculty researchers (100 faculty) conducting researches aligned to their field of specialization. There was a marked increase in the number of faculty researchers who are engaged in research vertically from 2021 and continually increasing in 2022. This may be explained by the intensive programs of the faculty and staff development embarked on by the College where more faculty members

were sent to universities, local and international, pursuing graduate studies. Thus, upon returning to the college they are encouraged to propose and conduct researches aligned to the R & D agenda and their specialization. Moreover, researchers worked towards addressing the needs of the community and industry as well as provided solutions to emerging challenges.

Number of externally funded researches

The College forged linkages with national funding agencies since the trend now is to conduct research in a collaborative endeavor and a multidisciplinary approach. The national funding agencies are: DOST-IX, DOST PCAARRD and WESMAARRDEC, DA-BAR and BSWM. Research outputs were delivered within the year even in time of pandemic. Though the Covid-19 pandemic presented challenges to the conduct of research, 9 researches in 2022. Targets were still reached and researches completed within the time-frame. This shows that researchers are really motivated in conducting their researches.

Faculty researchers were aiming to publish their research outputs to international refereed and ISI/ Elsevier Scopus journals. Moreover, the college's way of rewarding the faculty who publishes by giving publication incentives boosted their eagerness to publish in international or ISI or Elsevier Scopus journals.

In 2022, a high percentage (86.02%) of research outputs presented in the regional, national and international fora and conferences.

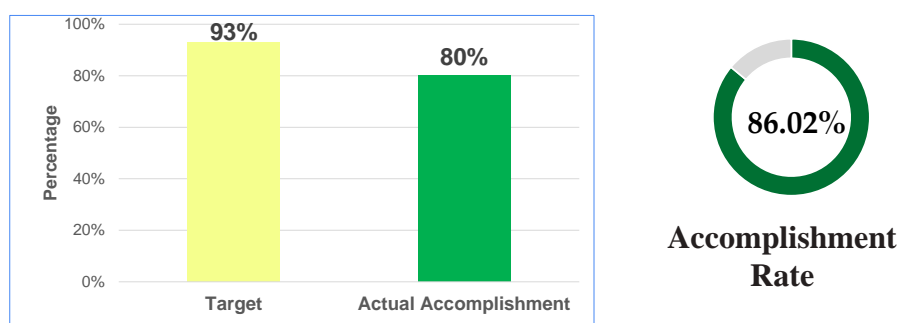


Figure 6: Percentage Research Outputs and Outcomes

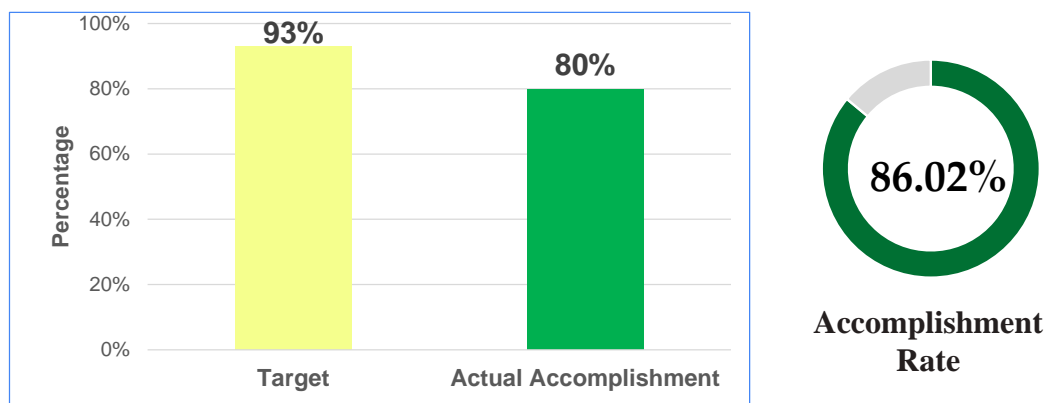


Figure 8: Number of research outputs published in the internationally-referred or CHED recognized journal within the year.

Intellectual Property Office registers JHCSC's first utility model

The Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL) has recently issued the registration certificate for JHCSC's first utility model, courtesy of the JHCSC Dumingag Campus.

After several years of waiting, the IPOPHL released the certificate for the Utility Model titled ORGANIC COFFEE innovated by Dr. Nanette D. Bilbao, the present administrator of JHCSC Dumingag Campus from the School of Teacher

Education (STE). It was officially registered on November 3, 2021 with a term until July 9, 2028.

Similar to patents, utility models protect new technical inventions through granting a limited exclusive right to prevent others from commercially exploiting the protected inventions without consents of the right holders, according to the World Intellectual Property Office.

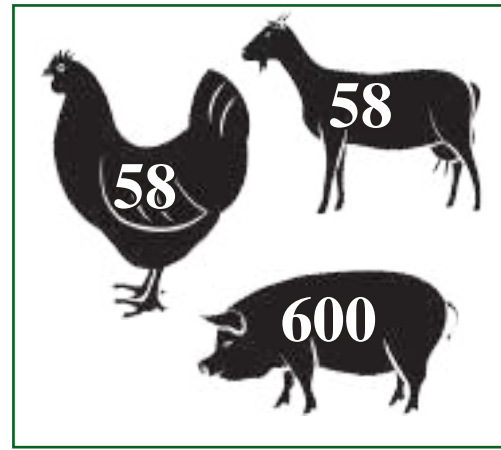

EXTENSION SERVICES

Community Extension Services

The three organic campuses of the college jointly implement the mandated functions of technical advisory and extension programs. Number of active partnerships with LGUs, industries, NGO's, NGA's, MSME's and other stakeholders as a result of extension activities

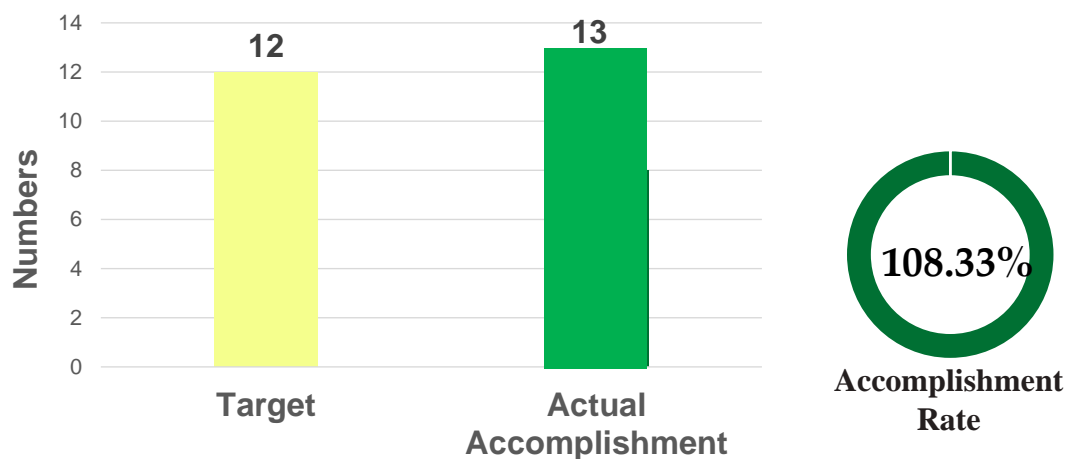


Figure 9: Number of active partnerships with LGUs, industries, NGO's, NGA's, MSME's and other stakeholders as a result of extension activities

Good partnerships with stakeholders are needed to reach the beneficiaries, local communities, of extension programs, projects and activities (PPAs). For the past years of doing extension PPAs by the colleges, campuses and Community Extension Services Office as well as identified LGUs, industries, NGOs, NGAs, MSMEs and other stakeholders have greatly contributed

to the success of PPAs. To date, as many as 13 partnerships materialized in 2022 which is equivalent to a 108.33% accomplishment rate of active partnerships as the institution continued its extension activities by partnering with LGUs, AFP, TESDA, and other agencies despite the prevailing crisis due to Covid-19 pandemic.

This was measured by the number of trainees weighted by the length of training. An observed increase of 104.51% rate of accomplishment in 2022.

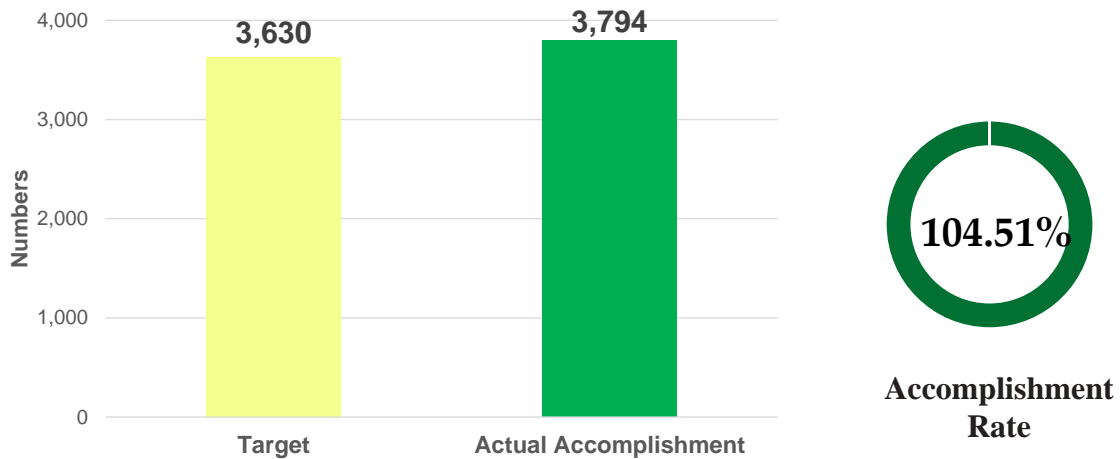


Figure 10: Number of trainees weighted by the length of training

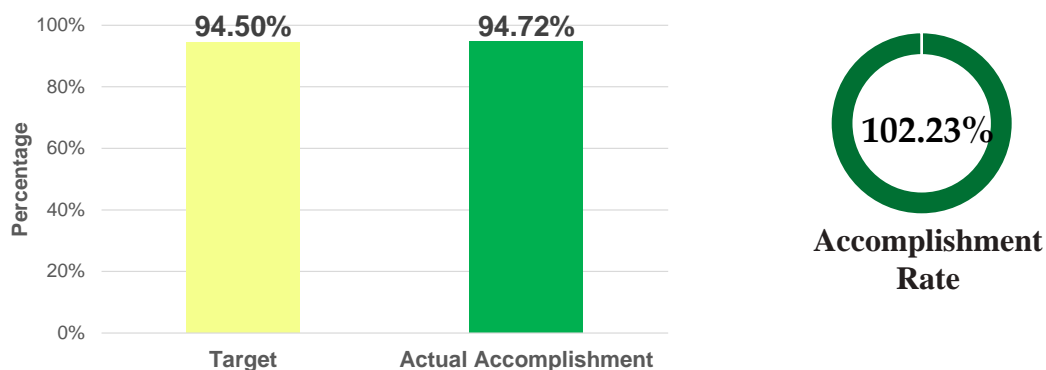


Figure 12: The Percentage of beneficiaries who rate the training course/s as satisfactory or higher in terms of quality and relevance.


